- E. Minutes of January 19, 2012 Meeting Peter Hutchins

Minutes of the January 19, 2012 Board of Governors meeting **were approved as presented.**

- F. Financial Statements through December 2011 Rob Howard

The **Board received** financial statements through December 2011, as approved by the BOG Committee on Administration.

PRESENTATION / DISCUSSION / ACTION ITEMS

- G. Attorney Discipline Office Issues Jennifer Parent

- ABA Review Recommendations Follow-up

President Jennifer Parent reported that a study team from the ABA Standing Committee on Professional Discipline (requested by the Court) issued a 73-page report to the NH Supreme Court that recommends administrative and procedural changes to the NH attorney discipline system. There are a total of 18 recommendations - some sweeping, some minor -- to the NH attorney discipline process.

In a letter to Bar President, NH Supreme Court Chief Justice Linda Stewart Dalianis asked the Bar for its help "in evaluating the recommendations and in formulating our own plans for those changes that would benefit the public and New Hampshire attorneys."

The Court initially asked for comments from the Bar Association by March 15 on the 18 recommendations (some with multiple elements). The Bar President has asked the court to consider extending the period for comment on the lengthy, far-reaching report. Jennifer has appointed a work group of Bar members who have previously served on the PCC or have experience in disciplinary matters to shape a response to the recommendations for consideration by the NHBA Board of Governors.

The Court asked that the ABA report be posted on the Bar's website and that the NHBA gather comments from the membership.

The posted material is expected to include a summary outline of the report's findings and recommendations, with citations to current rules and practices, compiled by NHBA Vice President Jaye Rancourt who currently sits as the NHBA representative on the PCC.

Secretary Peter Hutchins expressed concern that financial impact and due process issues for members would be whittled away by some of the recommendations in the report. Peter also sees the Association role and authority in the process being diminished.

Jennifer encouraged all Board members to read the report and provide their feedback to the Bar Association

- Website Posting of Decisions Update Jennifer Parent

President Jennifer Parent reported that she has sent a letter to the Court outlining the Board's concerns with the ADO posting orders of the PCC upon the orders being issued and not waiting for the time period to expire for Motions to Reconsider to be filed and/or for appeals to the New Hampshire Supreme Court to be concluded. The letter conveyed a request that the initiative be forwarded to the Supreme Court Advisory Committee on Rules for consideration.

- H. Legislation Updates John MacIntosh

John MacIntosh, NHBA Legislative Representative, reported that House Judiciary approved HB 1395 eliminating Mandatory IOLTA and passed HB 1474 a deunification bill. In addition, CACR 22 and CACR 26 impacting Court rule-making both passed. John expects HB 1474, CACR 22 and CACR 26 will go to Senate Judiciary after the House votes next week. The Senate is likely to start hearings on House Bills in March/April.

John also reported that the Bill containing revisions to the Safe Act is heading to the Governor from the Senate.

- I. Hillsborough South Bill (HB 1655) Jennifer Parent

President Jennifer Parent reminded the Board that Howie Zibel (Court's rep) and Kent Barker (Nashua Bar rep) are coming to the Board meeting later today to discuss the Hillsborough South bill (which would recombine the north and south districts of Hillsborough County Superior Court in Manchester) before the legislature. Jennifer asked Board members to be thinking about whether the Board should take a position on this legislation or not.

- J. Circuit Court Call Center Update Jane Bradstreet & Patrick Ryan

Jane Bradstreet and Patrick Ryan of the Circuit Court Call Center updated the Board as follows:

- Circuit Court Call Center opened January 4, 2012 on Chennell Drive in Concord.

- Brigitte Siff Holmes is the Call Center Administrator
- Circuit Court calls in Coos, Merrimack and Manchester are now being routed through the Call Center
- Grafton Circuit Court calls will be going through the Call Center beginning February 29th; Nashua will follow soon after
- All Circuit Court calls will be going through the Call Center by July 1st
- Statistics were distributed that show 65% of all calls coming into the Call Center are answered by a Call Center rep; meaning only 35% of all calls are sent to a specific Court, saving the clerk's offices 773 hours (to date) of what would otherwise be time spent on the phone

K. Hillsborough South Bill (continued)

Howie Zibel recapped the history of how legislation to close Superior Court in Nashua came to be, what the cost savings is anticipated to be (\$313,000), and provided a list of reasons why the Court believes this move is a good one.

Kent Barker recited statistics the Nashua Bar has pulled together concerning the size of the population now served by Hillsborough South Superior Court, outlined a number of issues with the projected cost savings figures provided by the Court and discussed the overall opposition by business and community leaders in and around Nashua of this proposal.

There was Board discussion with questions.

President Jennifer Parent thanked both Howie and Kent for coming to the Board meeting.

L. Leadership Academy Update

Jaye Rancourt

Vice President and Leadership Academy Steering Committee Co-Chair Jaye Rancourt reported that the February 9th module was on the Executive/Legislative Branches. The group participated in a Mock Legislative Hearing and panel discussion that included: Senator Matthew Houde, Chair of the NH Senate Judiciary Committee; Robert E. Clegg, Jr., former State Senator, current partner in Legislative Solutions, LLC; and Bonnie Packard, former State Representative, current Director of Governmental Relations at Orr & Reno, PA

The Leadership Academy groups, of which there are two, will be presenting their projects to the Board at the March 6th Board Dinner Meeting in Manchester. The two projects are:

- "Fostering Legal Independence" – geared to NH children who have recently, or will soon, "age out" of the New Hampshire foster care system.
- NH Attorney Work-Life Balance – a website of information and resources demonstrating how to achieve a healthy work-life balance for members of the New Hampshire legal profession

O. President's Report

- Deunification Bill – Jennifer reported that in spite of what she thought was a good hearing in House Judiciary re: the deunification bill; it passed and is now going to the Senate. The following items were distributed to the Board: 1) letter sent to members in 2004 (when this same issue was before the legislature); 2) stats on unified bars around the county; and 3) a comparison of what members pay NHBA v. what they would have to pay for licensure/registration to a state entity.
- Gold Stars – this month go to Lisa Wellman-Ally and Jason Crance for stepping up to help with *Civics In Action* presentations in their “neck of the woods”; to Derek Lick for agreeing to serve on the Subcommittee working on the ABA Report on the ADO; and to Jonathan Eck for agreeing to Chair the Annual Meeting Awards Nominating Committee (volunteers to help Jonathan on this group are needed).
- Midyear Membership Meeting – Jennifer reported that over 500 members are signed up for CLE's and we have approximately 600 scheduled at the Honors & Awards Luncheon.
- Uniform Bar Examination Feedback to Court – Jennifer sent a letter to the Court identifying items of significance and consequence to the Board, and noting that the Association would like to continue to be involved in discussions about NH-specific parameters of the UBE.

- National Conference of Bar Presidents – Jennifer announced that Jack Middleton will be receiving the National Conference of Bar Presidents Fellows Award at the Annual Meeting in Chicago this coming August.
- ABA Day in DC – Jennifer announced that L. Jonathan Ross will be receiving an advocacy award in DC in April.
- Update on 2012 Board Election – Nomination petitions, bios and candidate statements are due March 1.
