WTP Program Outcomes: Evidence-Based Learning

Randomized control trial studies of high-need students conducted by the Civic Education Research Lab (CERL) at Georgetown University found significant positive learning effects from We the People.

The We the People curriculum is an innovative course of instruction on the history and principles of the government of the United States for grades 3-12.


AT A GLANCE
